Okaloosa County Offices Reopen

Okaloosa County, Fla. – Employees of the Okaloosa County Board of Commissioners will resume normal working hours as of midnight Tuesday evening. All employees who are scheduled to work should report as usual. County offices will re-open at 8 a.m. Wednesday morning.

Double red flags are currently posted at Okaloosa County public beaches. No swimming or wading is permitted.

The Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office urges caution to those traveling along US Highway 98 on Okaloosa Island as water is approaching the roadway near Beasley Park.

A 400-foot section of Meigs Drive is closed due to water on the roadway. Access is available to both sides, but through traffic is not allowed.

Local marinas encourage boat owners to make sure their boats are secured as local waters are high and choppy. Boaters are urged to check boats moored in the bayous as there are reports of boats breaking loose and damaging other boats.

The EOC remains open with limited personnel.
