JOINT PRESS RELEASE: OKALOOSA COUNTY PUBLIC NOTICE OF SEWAGE SPILL WITH HEALTH ADVISORY

Okaloosa County, Fla. – The health advisory issued by the Florida Department of Health in Okaloosa County (DOH-Okaloosa) continues to be in effect for the following bodies of water in Okaloosa County until further notice:

- Lake Vivian (also known as Lake Clyde)
- Choctawhatchee Bay in Shalimar

Okaloosa County Water and Sewer (OCWS) reported a sewage spill due to an overflow of a wastewater manhole located at the intersection of Bayshore Drive and Palm Boulevard in Shalimar, Florida. An estimated 2,800-gallon sewage spill occurred, and the wastewater overflowed into a storm drain that discharges into Lake Vivian. OCWS representatives reported that the spill has now been contained and cleanup actions have been completed. Sewage did not get into any drinking water sources, and water available through the public water system is safe to drink. OCWS will continue to conduct water sampling and testing in the area until the bacteria levels are within the recommended standard. People in the area are urged to take precautions when in contact with the affected bodies of water.

Waters contaminated with wastewater overflow present several health hazards to humans and may contain untreated human sewage with microbes that could cause gastrointestinal and other diseases. Anyone who comes into contact with the affected waterways should wash thoroughly, especially before eating or drinking. Children and older adults, as well as people with weakened immune systems, are particularly vulnerable to disease.
